Vocabulary Strategy: Reference Materials

Target Skill and Strategy:

- Conclusion inferences; something figured out from evidence
- Generalization a kind of conclusion that is true about something MOST of the time
- Idiom an expression whose meaning is different than the meaning of its words

Grammar Skill: Relative Pronouns and Adverbs

- Clause a group of words that has a subject and a predicate
- Independent Clause a clause that stands alone because complete sentence
- Dependent Clause a clause that cannot stand along because not a complete sentence
- Relative Pronoun type of pronoun used to introduce a dependent clause that gives more information about a noun
- Relative Adverb a type of adverb used to introduce a dependent clause that gives more information about time, place, or reason
